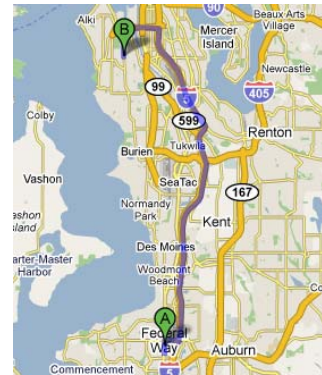
Direction to Sealth Stadium

Federal Way 19, Auburn 0

Returning two starters from the year before, the Federal Way Hawks 89ers had a lot of unanswered questions going into the first game. Nerves and inexperience led to some sloppiness but in the end the Hawks 89er athletes prevailed beating their cross-town rivals the Auburn Panthers 19-0.

#13 Michael Rogers began the scoring when on the third play from scrimmage he ran a sweep for 40 yards and a touchdown. Auburn's first play from scrimmage resulted in a fumble which was recovered by #1 Koby Okezie. The Hawk 89ers then turned right around and fumbled the ball back to Auburn. That kind of summed up the first half and the Hawks led 6-0 at halftime.

The second half opened up with an awesome kickoff by #30 Jaydion Laster, pinning Auburn deep in their own territory. After a four and out by the Hawk defense, the Hawk's took over and preceded trying the new game plan implemented at halftime. The strategy worked beautifully as #1 Koby Okezie went off-tackle on the third play of second half and went 22 yards for the touchdown. The Hawk offense then went back to their struggling ways. When the fourth quarter started the Hawks decided to try an end around, which produced a 72-yard touchdown run for #59 Daniel Shocks. The defense which was solid all day, held on to preserve the victory.

The 89ers were led by #59 Daniel Shocks who had 72 yards on his lone carry and a touchdown. #13 Michael Rogers had 45 yards on 3 carries and a touchdown. #1 Koby Okezie had 45 yards on 7 carries and touchdown. #9 Isaiah Hoit finished the day with 27 yards on two carries.

The hawk defense was led by #13 Michael Rogers. The third year 89er had 8 1/2 tackles. #1 Koby Okezie had 5 1/2 tackles a fumble recovery and an interception. The two defensive ends #59 Daniel Shocks and #30 Jaydion Laster each had 2 1/2 tackles. #39 Devon Murray had two tackles. #47 Jayhlen Washington, #5 Asher Shakoor-Asadi, and #50 Isaiah Dunn each had 1 1/2 tackles. #21 Pehrlys Avington, #9 Isaiah Hoit, #15 Malik Henry, and #45 Kasi Saunders each finished with one tackle.

The Silver Bullets did a fantastic job this weekend and featured beautiful offensive performances by #12 Alex Rogers and #51 Anthony McGuire, keep up the great work!

The Federal Way Hawks 89ers, who are now 1-0 league and 1-0 overall, will work hard in practice, to clean up a few things. The Hawks travel to West Seattle this Saturday to take on the S.W.A.C. Cougars. Good Luck Hawks!!!
