Letter From The President

Welcome to the 2012 Hamilton Hurricanes season!

At this time I would like to thank all of the volunteers, staff, and the fans for making the 2011 season so successful. You gave tremendous support to our players on their run to capturing the Ontario Football Conference Championship for the second consecutive year and as the hosts for the Canadian Bowl Championship at Ivor Wynne Stadium.

The 2012 season is shaping up to be a great one for the Hurricanes. We are pleased to announce that thirty-five players from last year's Championship team are returning this season, in addition to thirty-five new signees who were recruited and added to the team this past off-season. One of the most regarded signings was that of Middle Linebacker Adam Grilj. This will allow for great match-ups each and every week and will make for exciting on-field action. The Hurricanes face new challenges every year and we are always retooling and scheming to put the most competitive team on the field. Our coaching staff and management have been working extremely hard this off-season to find the best players in the area and bring them to the team and allow the Hurricanes to make another run for a championship. The Canes will open the season with their first four-out-of-five games at home. The awards for the 2011 season were handed out to the players at the Hamilton Hurricanes Gala in April. All of the recipients were very deserving of their awards. The players on the 2011 team played with so much heart, determination, and drive that they made the opposition's on-field attempts seem futile in comparison. Two of the stand-out players from this past year were Danny Brown and Troy Croonen. Both athletes were excited to share their thoughts on the past season, their award honours, and what their futures hold. Danny Brown is a retired offensive lineman who will be taking his spot on the coaching staff to help with the offensive line. He is the 2011 Sam Mercanti Community Award winner. Danny was asked what it means to him to be a Hurricane and he answered

with, "To me, being a Hurricane meant that as a team, we were going to get prepared, out-work, and out-play other teams to get the win".
