

## 2009 Pacific District Select Camp Code of Conduct

We ask that you consider your participation at the Pacific District Tryout as an honor and a privilege. Remember, you are representing the district, your state, your home program and most importantly yourself at the tryout. For the purposes of the tryout your conduct both on and off the ice is considered.

- Be respectful at all times. Be alert to all instructions given both on and off the ice. Profanity and vulgar behavior will not be tolerated.

- Dress appropriately. Neat Casual dress is appropriate for the weekend. Bare midriffs, halter tops, short shorts and torn clothing are not. Any players not dressed appropriately will be asked to change.

- Be on time. You are responsible for knowing your schedule. Tardiness to any scheduled activity will not be tolerated and may jeopardize your ice time.

- Only camp participants and staff are allowed in the locker rooms, tryout meeting room and participant hotel rooms, unless specifically noted by the camp director.

Individuals who are not tryout staff or participants are not allowed in participant rooms.

- Alcoholic beverages, mood altering drugs, possession of non prescription drugs and/or tobacco in any form are prohibited. Prescription and nonprescription medication needs to be clearly labeled and be accompanied by a signed consent form from a parent or guardian. This includes any over the counter medication. Violation of this policy may result in immediate dismissal from the tryout.

- A strict curfew will be enforced for the benefit of all players. Participants are required to be in their assigned rooms at 10:00 PM and lights out at 10:30. Violation of this rule could jeopardize your ice time and lead to your dismissal from the camp.

- Clean up after yourself at all times. You are responsible for condition of your locker room, hotel room and meeting areas. Any damage or addition cleaning fees will be assessed to the players or team assigned to the room.

- Any on ice rules violation warranting a major, misconduct, game misconduct, or match penalty will result immediate removal from the game. The incident will be referred to the camp director for further action up to and including immediate dismissal from the camp.

- Any action that, in the opinion of the camp director and staff, is deemed to be detrimental to the well being of the program will result in suspension or dismissal from the camp and will affect eligibility for future Pacific District and USA Hockey programs.

- If a player is dismissed from the tryout for misconduct transportation home will be at the player own expense.

I have read and will abide by this code of conduct. I understand that violation of this code of conduct may result in my immediate dismissal (at the expense of the participant) from the Pacific District tryout and jeopardize my participation in the future.
