## Overview

The Flagstaff Youth Hockey Association (FYHA) is a Youth Hockey organization located in Flagstaff, Arizona. Under the direction of an all volunteer Board of Directors, FYHA offers opportunities for children ages 18 & under in both our Recreational (House) and Competitive (Travel) hockey programs. After age 14, our players can join the Flagstaff Avalanche High School Hockey Club at the Junior Varsity and Varsity levels, or otherwise skate at the FYHA Midget level provided we have enough Midget aged skaters to field a travel team.

FYHA is sanctioned through USA Hockey. The objective of the association is to provide an environment where our youth can learn the game of hockey and excel at the recreational, regional, and national levels. This document is intended to provide our parents and players with basic information ranging from the management of the association to how conflicts should be resolved with the coaches, and the roles and responsibilities of parents. Please accept a warm welcome from our Board of Directors, Officials and the entire Coaching Staff.

## Organization

FYHA is managed and directed by an all volunteer Board of Directors (BOD). Elections are held each spring at the Presidential Banquet. ## Required House & Travel HOCKEY Equipment List

Required Equipment: FYHA and our insurance require that each player wear the proper equipment prior to taking the ice. Without the proper equipment, the coach will not allow the player on the playing surface, and the officials will remove the player from the playing surface if they spot an equipment violation.

# MOVE UP POLICY

Rules of USA Hockey provide that a player may be too old to play in a certain division, but a player is never too young. Theoretically, you could have an eight year old playing on a Bantam team. Obviously, size, skill, experience, maturity all enter into the decision of which division is best for that player.

When a player wants to play in a division higher than he would be required to play in, the following policy applies:

## **RULES/ At time of Try outs**

1. A Player is to Register online in both teams/divisions; the age appropriate team and the desired team
2. The Parent/Player is to print, fill and sign the 'Petition to Move Up' Form
3. The Player is to attend both the desired team and the age appropriate group 1<sup>st</sup> tryouts.
  - a. Parent to bring 2 copies of the "Petition to Move Up" form; one for each team/division head coach at time of tryouts.
- 4a. If the desired team coach does not have a spot on the team for that child to be on and denies the petition
  - b. the desired team coach is to notify the Player that his petition has been denied
  - c. And that child is to then continue attending the age appropriate team if he wants a spot on that team. Process completed.
- 4b. If the desired team coach does have a spot on the team for that child and approves the petition
  - a. The desired team coach needs to notify the BOD directly or through Coaching Coordinator after the 1<sup>st</sup> try out session and before the 2<sup>nd</sup> try out session so a BOD vote can be made to support this petition or deny this petition.
  - b. BOD will notify Both Team Coach(s) or Coaching Coordinator of Approval or Denial.
    - a. If Approved- Child can continue try outs with desired team and no longer be eligible to attend the age appropriate team try outs
    - b. If Denied- Child will need to attend age appropriate try outs and no longer attend the desired team try outs.

## **Temporary Move up Policy for Games within FYHA**

If your child is asked to play in a higher division game, by that coach, to help 'fill in the bench', you and that coach asking must still comply with the 'Move Up policy' and fill out, print and sign the '[Petition to Move Up](#)' form.

On these temporary situations, both Coach(s) must approve the request but to help eliminate the time frame these situations have, the Coaching Coordinator and BOD will not need to approve these temporary type of request

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1) Player Ability: In order for the move-up to be approved, the player must demonstrate exceptional ability and have the potential to be considered for the competitive or recreational team in the next higher division. Coaches at both levels will determine this capability and whether or not the player will make an impact at that next division level.
- 2) Teams Impact: Consideration will be given as to how the move up will impact the two divisions involved. The number of players within each division will be considered.
- 3) A move up, upon approval, guarantees full division membership at the approved level, either recreational or competitive.
- 4) Travel/Competitive Team Impact: This can create a problem when, in fact, the younger player can make the competitive team at his own age division. Example: There are only twenty Midgets and only one full team of Midget players. A Bantam wants to move up. The Bantam would displace a Midget who would then have no division to play in. This result may not be allowed.
- 5) Coaches Input: The coaches' input from both levels will be crucial in aiding the Board when reviewing the application. These individuals will be evaluating the ability of the player as well as all other considerations before a decision will be made.
- 6) The Board will contact the parent(s) and player once a decision is made. Until that time, it will be assumed that the player is a part of the team on which he/she is registered appropriately by age. If in fact the player is accepted into the higher division, additional fees for the higher division will be assessed.
- 7) Upon a player's acceptance at an upper level, should circumstances develop that skills/ability show a decline, the player will return to the level he is originally assigned by age.

# HOUSE HOCKEY

The house program offers an alternative to the competitive environment of travel hockey. Families participating in the house program can expect to pay less and not travel. The house program is designed for skill development and hockey without the hassle. In other words, they would still practice and play, but it would be significantly less competitive. No travel would be required and missing practices here and there to accommodate family would not be a problem.

FYHA House does not offer any 'Checking' in the House programs. If your child is approaching the age where they are considering playing hockey at the High School or College level, it would be best for your child to be in the Travel Program. Keep in mind, there is a try-out involved for competitive hockey. The child would need to be selected for the team. If that happens, the family would need to commit to a fairly rigorous travel schedule as well as regular practices to prepare for competition.

FYHA's In-House program practices/scrimmages/plays games against other in house teams twice per week, once during the weekdays and once during the weekends.

## Groups

During the 2009-2010 seasons FYHA is fielding House Teams for the following age groups:

- Mini Mites (aka Atoms) (ages 4-7)  
(This program is for Beginners/New on Skates)
- Mite House (aka Junior House) (ages 5-8)
- Squirt House (aka Senior House) (ages 9-10)
- Peewee House (aka Senior House) (ages 11-12)
- Bantam House (aka Senior House) (ages 13-14)

\*You must register your child in the proper age group. If you are wanting to register in a different aged group then what your child falls in, please follow the proper '[Move Up Policy](#)' and fill out the '[Petition to move up form](#)'.

Your child is to practice on the age appropriate team (unless petition to move up approved) that you are paid and rostered for and not to be on the ice for other divisions practices at any time.

\*\*Depending on the number of registrations and available ice, the groups may be combined or there may be two groups for one age level.

## Games and Practices

The Full season consists of approximately 25 weeks at the Jay Lively Ice rink. Practices begin in early September. No practices/Games will occur during Thanksgiving, Christmas, Martin Luther King, Presidents Day and Spring Break holidays.

### **The Cost**

House program is broken up in two seasons, Fall and Spring. The registration fee for House teams is \$160 for a one sessions (1/2 season), or \$320 for a both sessions (full season), which is typically less than one third of what the cost is to play Recreational Hockey for other Arizona associations. All House Players are provided with Jerseys and socks that must be returned to FYHA at the end of the season.

### **Payment**

Payment must be made in full at Registration to hold your child spot and full payment must be made before your child is allowed to be on the ice. THERE WILL BE NO EXCPECTIONS TO THIS RULE, your child **WILL NOT** be permitted on the ice until full payment is completed.

### **House Registration(s)**

**Typically we will offer a recreational program for Fall, Spring & Summer:**

All Registration, Fall, Spring & or Summer, you will need to do the initial registration form online [www.fyha.org](http://www.fyha.org). This is so we can get your data into our computer system properly. We also take payment online.

When Registration opens for any of the above programs you will see a link on the top of our webpage [www.FYHA.org](http://www.FYHA.org) labeled with the proper name for the current program to register in. i.e. 'Summer Registration' or 'House Registration' or 'Spring House Registration'.

For registration time lines, forms (you will need printed & signed) and any instructions, please go to [www.FYHA.org](http://www.FYHA.org) click on '[Registration process](#)' and scroll down to the section you are looking for information on.

There is a limited amount of participants in each program so make sure you sign up promptly.

We provide registration 'check in' the first week of any new program, which will be at the ice rink in the lobby. At Registration 'check in' you are to bring in all your forms and payment in full. Everyone will need to 'check in' before heading to the locker rooms. Without payment and all proper forms filled out and signed, your child is not considered registered and will not be able to be on the ice.

# TRAVEL HOCKEY

Travel Hockey is the most competitive level of Hockey offered at FYHA. Travel players can expect to pay more, travel more and receive more ice time. As such, expectations placed on the families and players are high. Travel players are expected to attend all practices, games, and tournaments. Although absences are understandable and will occur, FYHA expects that absences will be the exception rather than the rule and must be excused by the head coach prior to any missed practice or game. FYHA requires that any rostered travel player make FYHA their number one priority. Players may roster with other teams only with the express written permission of their Travel Head Coach. Travel Season starts the beginning of September and ends in April. Please look on your team website, [www.fyha.org](http://www.fyha.org) for exact dates of games and practices. All updated information throughout the year will be provided to you on your team website and via your team manager/coach.

## Travel Registration

**Typically we will offer a recreational summer program, try outs (in April) and to those who make the team have a Travel season that starts SEPT and ends APRIL**

All Registration, Summer, Try outs (APRIL), and Travel season, you will need to do the initial registration form online [www.fyha.org](http://www.fyha.org). This is so we can get your data into our computer system properly. We also take payment online.

When Registration opens for any of the above programs you will see a link on the top of our webpage [www.FYHA.org](http://www.FYHA.org) labeled with the proper name for the current program to register in. i.e. 'Summer Registration' or 'Travel Try Our Registration' or 'xx/xx Travel Registration'.

For registration time lines, forms (you will need printed & signed) and any instructions, please go to [www.FYHA.org](http://www.FYHA.org) click on '[Registration process](#)' and scroll down to the section you are looking for information on.

We provide registration 'check in' the first week of any new program, which will be at the ice rink in the lobby. At Registration 'check in' you are to bring in all your forms and payment in full. ### Tryouts

Before attending FYHA Tryouts:

Please go to [www.fyha.org](http://www.fyha.org) / click on link '[Travel Try Outs Registration](#)' and follow instructions.

Your child will need to try out for the appropriate age related group. If your child plans to petition to move up, please read the 'Move Up Policy' for the procedure/instructions on how to 'Petition to Move Up'.

You will need to bring a check to try outs; make check to 'FYHA' in the amount of \$150. If your child is accepted a position on the team, it will be cashed as the deposit (see payment information below). If your child is not accepted a position on the team your check will be mailed back to you un cashed.

If you child makes the travel team the coach will notify you within a week from the tryouts.

Your child is to practice on the age appropriate team (unless petition to move up approved) that you are paid and rostered for and not to be on the ice for other divisions practices at any time.

If your child is asked, by the Head coach, to play in a higher division game within FYHA, to 'fill in the bench' due to a lack of current able players, you must fill out a 'petition to move up' form and have it approved with your child(s) current coach (the board of directors do not need to approve these type of temporary move ups) .

If there is not enough interest to field a team, or it is the decision of the head coach and or board not to do so, a full refund will be given to those who have paid and signed. If he/she chooses, he/she will be able to pay and join the House Hockey program.

Due to the competitive nature of Travel Hockey, your child is not guaranteed to see equal playing time in every game. Please check with the individual Travel Head Coaches for their team specific philosophy on player ice time during competitive games.

Costs

The anticipated costs of the FYHA Travel Team membership for the 2009/2010 session:

- \$525 For Travel Team Membership

Your dues are expected to cover the cost of Sonoran League, cost of Flagstaff ice and Cost of Referees for home games, for the season. If any of those cost are not covered with the 'Travel Team Membership', you will be billed for the additional monies in January.

Once your child registers and is chosen to be rostered on a Travel Team, there will be no refunds.

Travel Parents are responsible for the cost of travel to away games, such as fuel, lodging, meals, etc.

PAYMENT

FYHA needs to be able to pay some fees in the summer to hold our spot in the league and pre buy our socks for the season. So we will require a \$150 non refundable deposit at tryouts; if you are accepted a position on the team it will be cashed; if you are not accepted position on the team then the check will be mailed back to you un cashed.

The Rest of the balance will be due at Registration 'check in'

Your child **WILL NOT** be permitted on the ice until full payment is received and forms are turned in signed. THERE WILL BE NO EXCPECTIONS TO THIS RULE,

ONLY if FYHA does not field a travel team would any monies be refunded.

Travel Team Concession Stand Fundraising

Each team has the opportunity to run the concession stand during any FYHA home games as a Team Fundraiser; this allows your team to earn monies for extra games and/or tournaments to help the team offset cost for warm ups, jerseys etc. FYHA has instructions on how to do this you can find at [www.fyha.org](http://www.fyha.org) click on '[volunteer link](#)' / '[Concession Stand Package](#)' link.

Travel Tournament

FYHA will host a tournament for Martin Luther King Weekend named King of the Mountain aka KOM. Due to the amount of available ice we can host 2-3 of FYHA travel divisions. Due to the enormous amount of work to run the event, one of the factors of which 2-3 travel divisions will participate in this event will be dependant on which team parents' are willing to be Tournament Director and Tournament Coordinator and how many parents are willing to volunteer their time to help run this tournament. This tournament requires that all the FYHA parents/families participate and volunteer time during the tourney. If a majority of parents from all four travel divisions are wanting to participate and are willing to help, then the choice of which divisions will host the tournament will go to a board vote.

Travel Registration(s)

You Must Register Online, after you register you will have the option to pay with credit card online or to print and pay with check; if pay by check, bring check, bring all forms above, that apply, filled out and signed to the [Jay Lively Ice rink](#) and leave in our secure FYHA mail box located behind the rink counter or you can mail to our PO Box.

## CODES OF CONDUCT

### FYHA PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

It is the intention of this compact to promote Fair Play and Respect for all participants within Flagstaff Hockey. It is expected that all parents of Flagstaff Hockey participants read and understand the Parent's Code of Conduct and continue to observe and follow all the principles contained within the Code throughout the year.

1. Do not force your children to participate in sports, but support their desire to play their chosen sport. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment. Make it fun.
2. Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example, so applaud the good plays of both teams.
3. Do not embarrass your child by yelling at players, coaches or officials. Showing a positive attitude toward the game and all of its participants will benefit your child.
4. Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. De-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.
5. Know and study the rules of the game, and support the officials on and off the ice. This approach will help develop and support the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game.
6. Applaud good efforts in both victory and defeat, and enforce the positive points of the game. Never yell or physically abuse your child after a game or practice—it is destructive. Work toward removing the physical and verbal abuse in youth sports.
7. Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them.
8. If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about hockey—and volunteer.

### USA HOCKEY PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

For participation in USA Hockey for the 2009-2010 season:

1. Play for Fun
2. Work hard to improve your skills
3. Be a team player. Get along with your teammates
4. Learn teamwork, sportsmanship and discipline
5. Be on time for practices and games
6. Learn the rules and play by them. Always be a good sport
7. Respect your coach, your team mates, your opponents and the officials.
8. Respect the property of other, including team mates, opponents, rinks etc.
9. No swearing or abusive language on the bench, in the rink, or at any team function.
10. NO lashing out at any official no matter what the call is. The coaching staff will handle all matters pertaining to officiating.

11. Anyone who receives a penalty will skate directly to the penalty box.
12. Fighting will not be tolerated. Fighting will result in an appearance before a 'Discipline Committee' or BOD
13. There will be no drinking, smoking, chewing of tobacco, or use of illegal substance at any team function.
14. I will conduct myself befitting manner at all facilities (ice rink, hotel, restaurant, etc.) during all team functions.
15. Any player or team official who cannot abide by these rules or violates them will be subject to further disciplinary action.

I have read and understand the above FYHA and USA code of conducts, and agree to abide by its guidelines at all team and league activities. I understand if I do not follow the FYHA and USA Hockey Codes of Conduct, I may be asked to leave the league activity (such as a game or practice) or I may be asked to withdraw my child from the league.

### Jay Lively Ice Arena Rules

All parents must abide by Jay Lively Rules, including but not limited to:

1. Respect Our City Ice Rink
2. All players must dress in locker rooms, not in lobby area.
3. Parents are never allowed on the player benches during practices or games/ scrimmages.
4. No running in the Rink
5. No climbing, banging of the Lockers
6. No lingering or hanging out in the back locker rooms before and after practices or games
7. Each Team is to clean out their locker room before leaving

# VOLUNTEER AGREEMENT

2009-2010 SEASON

FYHA Needs Volunteers in all the positions listed below to run this NON Profit program. Our current programs we provide are:

1. House (Recreational)- we can have up to 3 age groups;
2. Travel (Competitive)- we can have up to 5 teams

## **Background**

If we are unable to get help at the Board level, the whole program cannot survive. If we cannot get help at each Team/Group level those teams may not survive or end up cancelled within the program. If we cannot get help with our committees, tournaments or fundraising that we rely on to help pay for ice and referees will not come through.

If FYHA were to run the program similar to Phoenix (paying the positions needed to run the program) we may end up losing a large percent of our players in the program when fees triple+ to accommodate that additional pay.

If FYHA continues to run with the needs and dependency on volunteers and if we don't get the volunteers each season; programs/teams/groups could end up canceled, leaving players not able to have a team to play on.

Just to understand the math on the volunteers we need at FYHA; we typically have around 100 House families and 80 Travel families; we need 50 of those to sign up for a FYHA volunteer position either at the Board level or the Travel or House level. PLUS we need all to help with the Team help jobs.
